New Business;

Item a. Kootenai River WRP Education/Outreach

- Mr. Dunnigan reported to the Supervisors the WRP is very close to completion; anticipated to be done by December. A major component of the WRP is stream restoration but public outreach is very important. The Kootenai River Network wants to extend an invitation and share information for funding sources to private landowners. The WRP allow for funding through DEQ and EPA; projects must be identified in the WRP to qualify for this funding. Even though a project is not specifically listed it could fall in generically.
- Mike Justus described the project Barry Roose is considering on Mud Creek.
- Staff added the conservation district has sponsored a 223 grant to prepare a conceptual design for the project.
- Mike Justus asked if this creek could be listed in the WRP.
- Mr. Dunnigan replied the stream must be listed in the TMDL, however, the project could be included in other ways.

Item d. Miller, Brimstone Creek

- Mr. Miller explained in the last few years Brimstone Creek during the months of July and August there has been no water coming through to his property. Above the private property in question there is plenty of water however between this land and the railroad grade there is no water flow. Water is going in but no water is coming out.
- Darris Flanagan asked if you can see a diversion from the railroad track.
- Mr. Miller responded no, but there is no water coming down.
- Darris Flanagan explained it is a water rights issue.
- Mike Justus agreed and added Mr. Miller is the senior water right holder.
- Mr. Miller stated there is a violation.
- Don Crawford asked if there had been any construction on the creek in the last 10 years.
- Mr. Miller replied yes.
- Darris Flanagan asked Mr. Miller on ways to approach the property owner.

- Don Crawford noted a complaint had been filed.
- Mike Justus responded we looked at the pond. There have been no disturbances to the stream bank.
- Don Crawford suggested we (LCD) contact the owner by telephone and ask if something has occurred to divert the water.
- Mike Justus replied the diversion was done years ago; the water right goes back to 1942.
- Mr. Miller stated he has contacted the property owner previously and got water right away.
- Don Crawford asked Mr. Miller if he has received an answer he is satisfied with.
- Mr. Miller replied no; no water on the other end.
- Mark Romey suggested Mr. Miller pursue the water rights.
- Don Crawford noted there is nothing for us (LCD) to do; ask a question is about all.
- Mr. Miller agreed that might be enough. The water is flowing right now.

Public Comment:

• Mr. Bill Hayes explained he lives on the east bank of Frank Lake. He worked a life time to build a dream home and has been through ups and downs of Frank Lake. Currently, the water is so low there are no boats; kayaks only. He has decided to do something about it. He began a quest with working with DNRC and has received a favorable response from MtFW&P. He is proposing to drill two wells off of the OHWM to feed the lake and keep it at full pool. He is working with hydrogeologists to conduct a feasibility study. Hopefully he is not over his head financially.

 to divert water from the dyke. Mike Justus proposed two (2) large dimensional
 rocks, 3 to 4' in size, be keyed in at least two (2) feet below stream bed and placed
 well into the bank. The rocks will be placed at a 45 degree angle and 10 feet down
 river from existing shrubs.

Motion by Mike Justus to approve Li-09-02-15 as presented with the following modifications: 2 large dimensional rocks, 3 to 4' in size, be keyed in at least 2 feet below stream bed and well into the bank. The rocks will be placed at a 45 degree angle and 10 feet down river from existing shrubs. Second by Susan Ennenbach. Motion passed.
